

Recent efforts to solve the problem of education — created by neoliberalism in and out of higher education — have centred on the implementation of technology that promises efficiency, progress tracking, and automation. This volume illustrates current socio-legal approaches to the study of the law as a key governing tactic and a form of power that creates and perpetuates systems of domination, notably white supremacy, settler colonialism, and heteronormative hegemony. Contributors outline theoretical and methodological strategies for deconstructing law, explore the hidden violence that the law produces for certain segments of the population, and discuss possibilities for challenging its power by identifying specific modes of resistance, and contributing directly to the project of social transformation.




Drink in the Summer: A Memoir of Croatia

Over time, he observed Srebrnjak become a white-collar weekend retreat, the peasant community of the 1970s, to which he was first introduced, only a distant memory. 
The Definition of Beautiful







Diagnosing Minor Illness in Children is a striking third collection by one of Canada's most essential poets. Kerry Ryan stares without flinching at everything in her path: family, grief, dog obituaries, fine-toothed lice combs, quotidian gore, a water slide that is "not a slide, it's a throat closing in," and herself as mother. The collection is replete with self-doubt and thorny humour, as when the speaker struggles to suckle a wolf pup while admiring the softness of her daughter's cheek. The poet, while staying close to home, sees herself (and us) in birds blown thousands of kilometres off course, and in reindeer defending their young. Ryan's vision of motherhood and midlife is fierce, edgy, and tender.

It Begins in Salt, a book of poems, wanders the halls of an ocean blue-collar life while rummaging the heart spaces of growing up, and evolves into mothering, labours, and loves. The poems explore the ways the heart grows, and the tentacles of complexity grow and evolve "to infinity." This book of poems is a love letter to those that share the tides of life. It urges us to love harder and give homage to those loved.

Van den Hoonaard recovers the unique history of research ethics in sociology and anthropology and provides an overview of proposals to remedy the situation. He advocates for embedding covenantal ethics in the professional training of researchers in the social sciences.

She also shares insights into life in Gaza during the British Mandate period as well as the 1948 Nakba and its aftermath. This title is part of the Women's Voices from Gaza Series.

This ethnography of Bhutanese refugees reveals how the language of compassion in humanitarianism is used to oppress vulnerable communities and erode their rights. Alice Neikirk conducted fieldwork with Bhutanese who fled Bhutan, resided in camps in Nepal, and finally settled in Australia. She observes that, in accepting the role of humanitarian subjects, refugees must abandon their role as contributors to the nation state and become satisfied with the position of guests. The experiences of the Bhutanese illustrate the complex strands of power that limit the scope of people who "deserve compassion." Neikirk describes how responses to refugee crises have shifted from facilitating the movement of people to enforcing their containment.


Canada as a Settler Colony on the Question of Palestine

Common themes include settler colonial destruction, dispossession, segregation, and otherness, along with accounts of people challenging those processes.
