ABOUT THE ALBERTA LITERARY AWARDS

The Alberta Literary Awards were created by the Writers' Guild of Alberta (WGA) in 1982 to recognize excellence in writing by Alberta authors. Entries are judged by independent juries recruited by the WGA. Submissions are evaluated on originality, creativity, and quality of writing, as well as an appropriate fit within a category.

Please refer to the WGA website (writersguild.ca) for a history of the awards and more information about the authors for whom our awards are named. The submission deadline is **December 1, 2023**. Winners will be announced and prizes awarded in the spring of 2024.

Read the Submission Guidelines & Rules and Submission Procedures carefully before submitting to the Alberta Literary Awards. For short pieces (essays, short fiction, and short nonfiction) and for the Edmonton and Calgary city book prizes there are additional rules and guidelines.

If an award receives less than eight entries, entries will be held for next year, or entries will be reassigned to other categories at staff discretion.

Submissions that fail to fulfill the Guidelines and Rules or that do not follow the proper Submission Procedures may be disqualified or withdrawn, and entry fees will not be refunded if a submission is disqualified as a result of not meeting the requirements.

Prizes of **\$1,500** will be awarded in the following book categories:

- Georges Bugnet Award for Fiction
- R. Ross Annett Award for Children's Literature (chapter book)
- Wilfrid Eggleston Award for Nonfiction
- Stephan G. Stephansson Award for Poetry
- Gwen Pharis Ringwood Award for Drama
- Memoir Award
- Short Story Collection Award

Prizes of **\$700** will be awarded in the following short works categories:

- Jon Whyte Memorial Essay Award
- Howard O'Hagan Award for Short Story
- James H. Gray Award for Short Nonfiction

BOOK PRIZES: GUIDELINES, RULES & PROCEDURES

Submission Guidelines & Rules:

- The deadline for submissions to the 2024 awards is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors of all entries in the Alberta Literary Awards must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published or produced anywhere in the world between **January 1 and December 31, 2023** (except in the children's literature and short story collection categories).
- Works not eligible for the awards are: unpublished manuscripts (except in the drama category), multi-author anthologies, works fewer than 48 pages in length (except in the drama and in the children's literature categories), e-books, books without traditional binding, and reprints of previously published books.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- If an award receives less than eight entries, entries will be held for next year, or entries will be reassigned to other categories at staff discretion.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- Pieces entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- All published book entries must be first editions with a copyright page, and have an ISBN.
- Short story, essay, or poetry collections may contain work that has been previously published as long as the collection in book form is a first edition.
- Unpublished plays (those scheduled for production or staged at a live reading in 2023) may be sent either as printed copies or electronic upload.
- French language entries will be accepted for competition into the **2025 Alberta Literary Awards** for Wilfrid Eggleston Award, the Memoir Award, the Short Story Collection Award, and the short works awards.
- Submissions for the Georges Bugnet Award, the Stephan G. Stephansson Award, the Gwen Pharis Ringwood Award, the R. Ross Annett Award, and for the cities of Edmonton and Calgary book prizes will be accepted in **French and English** for the **2024 Alberta Literary Awards**.

BOOK PRIZES: GUIDELINES, RULES & PROCEDURES, CON'T

Submission Procedures:

- Submit entry form at writersguild.ca/awards-entry.
- All entries and associated entry fees and materials (see below) must be submitted to the Writers' Guild of Alberta no later than **December 1, 2023**. (Please note: if your book is also entered in another award category we will need five copies per category).
- Materials sent by mail or courier must be postmarked no later than December 1st in order to be accepted. **An exception will be made for books published in December only if the WGA is notified of the late submission, in writing, in advance of the deadline.** (Please note that our offices will be closed between **December 18, 2023** and **January 1, 2024**, inclusive. We will reopen on January 2, 2024.)
- Submissions must include a completed online form and **five** copies of each book or play for each category entered.
- Submitted materials will not be returned.
- Submissions must be accompanied by a **\$35 fee per entry per category paid by credit card or cheque**. Please make cheques payable to the Writers' Guild of Alberta.
- Entries may be submitted by authors, publishers, or any interested parties.
- Books may be dropped off in person at the WGA Head Office in the Percy Page Centre in Edmonton on Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Fridays between **10:00 am** and **3:00 pm MT** as of the week of **September 18** until **December 1, 2023**.

Georges Bugnet Award for Fiction

Criteria:

This prize is awarded for a novel or collection of short fiction by an Alberta author published in 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$1500 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate and leather-bound copy of the winning book will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Works not eligible for this award are: unpublished manuscripts, multi-author anthologies, works fewer than 48 pages in length, e-books, books without traditional binding, and reprints of previously published books.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- Books entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- All published book entries must be first editions with a copyright page, and have an ISBN.
- Submissions for this category will be accepted in both English and French for the 2024 Alberta Literary Awards.

R. Ross Annett Award for Children's Literature

Criteria:

The children's literature category alternates yearly between picture and chapter books. The 2024 award will be presented to the Alberta author of a children's or teen chapter book (fiction or nonfiction) published in 2022 or 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$1500 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate and leather-bound copy of the winning book will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1, 2022** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Works not eligible for this award are: unpublished manuscripts, multi-author anthologies, works fewer than 48 pages in length, e-books, books without traditional binding, and reprints of previously published books.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- Books entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- All published book entries must be first editions with a copyright page, and have an ISBN.
- Submissions for this category will be accepted in both English and French for the 2024 Alberta Literary Awards.

Wilfrid Eggleston Award for Nonfiction

Criteria:

This prize is awarded for a nonfiction book by an Alberta author published in 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$1500 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate and leather-bound copy of the winning book will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Works not eligible for this award are: unpublished manuscripts, multi-author anthologies, works fewer than 48 pages in length, e-books, books without traditional binding, and reprints of previously published books.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- Books entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- All published book entries must be first editions with a copyright page, and have an ISBN.

Stephan G. Stephansson Award for Poetry

Criteria:

This prize is awarded for a collection of poetry by an Alberta author published in 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$1500 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate and leather-bound copy of the winning book will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Works not eligible for this award are: unpublished manuscripts, multi-author anthologies, works fewer than 48 pages in length, e-books, books without traditional binding, and reprints of previously published books.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- Books entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- All published book entries must be first editions with a copyright page, and have an ISBN.
- Submissions for this category will be accepted in both English and French for the 2024 Alberta Literary Awards.

Gwen Pharis Ringwood Award for Drama

Criteria:

- Awarded to a play written by an Alberta author published, produced or staged at a live reading in 2023.
- Plays submitted to the drama category may be one-act or full-length.
- Plays included in anthologies may be entered, as long as a separate entry form is filled out, and a separate entry fee is paid, for each play that the publisher or author wishes to submit to the award.
- Unpublished plays must have been scheduled for their premiere production with a minimum run of three consecutive performances or received a live reading between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**. Submissions must include proof of performance: ticket stubs, programs, confirmation email, etc.
- Unpublished manuscripts must be clean copy, typewritten or word-processed, in standard theatre-script format and securely bound at the left margin.
- An unpublished play may not be re-entered if it receives publication in a later year.
- Unpublished plays (those scheduled for production or staged at a live reading in 2023) may be sent either as printed copies or electronic upload.

Award:

- Prize money of \$1500 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate and leather-bound copy of the winning book will be given to the author

Gwen Pharis Ringwood Award for Drama, Con't

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published, produced or staged anywhere in the world between **January 1 and December 31, 2023**.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- Plays entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- All published book entries must be first editions with a copyright page, and have an ISBN.
- Submissions for this category will be accepted in both English and French for the 2024 Alberta Literary Awards.

Memoir Award

Criteria:

This prize is awarded for a nonfiction memoir by an Alberta author published in 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$1500 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate and leather-bound copy of the winning book will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Works not eligible for this award are: unpublished manuscripts, multi-author anthologies, works fewer than 48 pages in length, e-books, books without traditional binding, and reprints of previously published books.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.

Short Story Collection Award

Criteria:

This prize is awarded for a collection of fiction short stories by an Alberta author published in 2022 or 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$1500 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate and leather-bound copy of the winning book will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors must have been a resident of Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- All entries must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1, 2022** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Works not eligible for this award are: unpublished manuscripts, multi-author anthologies, works fewer than 48 pages in length, e-books, books without traditional binding, and reprints of previously published books.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a book in a category other than entered if deemed appropriate. The organization or individual entering the book will be notified of such changes.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.

SHORT WORKS: GUIDELINES, RULES & PROCEDURES

The Writers' Guild of Alberta (WGA) also strives to recognize excellence in Alberta writing by awarding three prizes to authors of short pieces. Entries are judged by an independent jury recruited by the WGA. Submissions are evaluated on originality, creativity, and quality of writing, as well as an appropriate fit within a category.

Please refer to the WGA website (writersguild.ca) for a history of the awards and information on the authors for whom our awards are named. The submission deadline is **December 1, 2023**. Winners will be announced and prizes awarded in the spring of 2024.

Submission Guidelines & Rules:

- The deadline for submissions to the 2024 awards is **December 1, 2023**.
- Authors of all entries must have resided in Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a piece in a category other than that entered if deemed appropriate. The individual or organization entering the piece will be notified of such changes.
- Pieces entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- French language entries for the short works awards will be accepted for competition into the **2025 Alberta Literary Awards**.

Submission Procedures:

- All entries and associated entry fees must be submitted to the Writers' Guild of Alberta no later than **December 1, 2023**. Entries must be submitted in PDF or Word format. **An exception will be made for short stories or short nonfiction published in December only if the WGA is notified of the late submission, in writing, in advance of the deadline.** (*Please note that our offices will be closed between December 18, 2023 and January 1, 2024, inclusive. We will reopen on January 2, 2024.*)
- Entries may be submitted by authors, publishers, or any interested parties.
- Online submission must be in standard manuscript format (double-spaced, page numbers indicated). The title or title abbreviation and word count of the piece should appear on each page of the manuscript.
- Submissions must be completed online and be accompanied by a **\$25 fee per entry per category, payable by credit card or cheque**. Please make cheques payable to the Writers' Guild of Alberta.
- Ineligible submissions will not be returned.

Howard O'Hagan Award for Short Story

Criteria:

This prize is awarded to an outstanding single short story by an Alberta author published in 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$700 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Entries must have been published in a print or electronic anthology, magazine, book, or literary journal anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Unpublished short stories and reprints of short stories published before 2023 are not eligible.
- Entries must be no longer than 8,000 words.
- Authors of all entries must have resided in Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a piece in a category other than that entered if deemed appropriate. The individual or organization entering the piece will be notified of such changes.
- Pieces entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- French language entries for this category will be accepted for competition into the 2025 Alberta Literary Awards.

James H. Gray Award for Short Nonfiction

Criteria:

This prize is awarded to an outstanding literary short nonfiction piece by an Alberta author on any topic published in 2023.

Award:

- Prize money of \$700 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- Entries must have been first published in a print or electronic newspaper, blog, magazine, anthology or journal anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Unpublished pieces and reprints of pieces published before 2023 are not eligible.
- Entries must be no longer than 5,000 words.
- Authors of all entries must have resided in Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a piece in a category other than that entered if deemed appropriate. The individual or organization entering the piece will be notified of such changes.
- Pieces entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- French language entries for this category will be accepted for competition into the 2025 Alberta Literary Awards.

Jon Whyte Memorial Essay Award

Criteria:

This prize is awarded to to an outstanding unpublished essay by an Alberta author.

Award:

- Prize money of \$700 will be given to the author
- Only one award will be given in this category
- A commemorative certificate will be given to the author

Eligibility:

- The deadline for submissions is **December 1, 2023**.
- The award is open to unpublished pieces only.
- Entries must be no longer than 3,000 words.
- The award employs a blind judging process. To facilitate this process, the author's name and identifying information (acknowledgements, email address, reference to previously published works, etc.) must not appear anywhere in the manuscript.
- Submissions must be original, previously unpublished in print or online, including personal blogs, and remain unpublished until the end of **April 2024**.
- Authors of all entries must have resided in Alberta for a minimum of twelve of the eighteen months prior to December 31, 2023.
- The WGA reserves the right to place a piece in a category other than that entered if deemed appropriate. The individual or organization entering the piece will be notified of such changes.
- Pieces entered in previous years may not be re-submitted to the same category.
- The WGA reserves the right not to present an award in any category if there are not a significant number of entries received.
- French language entries for this category will be accepted for competition into the 2025 Alberta Literary Awards.

ROBERT KROETSCH CITY OF EDMONTON BOOK PRIZE

The Robert Kroetsch City of Edmonton Book Prize was established by the City Council in 1995 and is administered by the Writers' Guild of Alberta (WGA). The prize was renamed in 2011 after the late Robert Kroetsch, who was best known for his Governor General's Award-winning novel, *The Studhorse Man*. Entries are judged by an independent jury recruited by the WGA. The winning author will receive a cash prize. The award is sponsored by Audreys Books and the Edmonton Arts Council. The winner will be announced and the prize awarded in the spring of 2024.

The Edmonton Arts Prizes celebrate artists from a range of art forms and practices, recognizing their work, and investing in their continued experimentation and creation. The prize program is coordinated by the Edmonton Arts Council, in collaboration with the City of Edmonton and our community partners, to enhance Edmonton's reputation as a hub for extraordinary creation in the arts.

Shared Eligibility and Assessment Criteria for the Edmonton Arts Prizes:

- Eligible artists/recipients must be a resident of the greater Edmonton region / amiskwaciy-waskâhikan. The greater Edmonton region is defined as the City of Edmonton, the Counties of Sturgeon, Parkland, Leduc and Strathcona, and the communities of Enoch Cree Nation, Alexander First Nation, Paul First Nation, and Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation.
- By the submission deadline, nominated artists must have a current profile (with all required fields completed) with the Edmonton Arts Council: eac.smartsimple.ca. Contact support@edmontonarts.ca or 780-424-2787 if you have questions or need help to create a profile.
- Prize recommendations in each discipline will be based on an evaluation of the artistic merits of a specific work, or collection of work, by a knowledgeable group of peer assessors.

ROBERT KROETSCH CITY OF EDMONTON BOOK PRIZE, CON'T

- Assessors will be charged with basing their decisions on the artwork's merits, including originality, creativity, relevance, and technical excellence. In all cases the prizes will attempt to recognize the highest standards of artistic achievement, regardless of the artist's particular mode of expression, or style within the genre.

In the case of equivalent merits, the assessors will be encouraged to consider the work in the context of the (in order):

- Artist's career;
- Relevant tradition(s), and arts practice in Canada;
- Representation of the demographic diversity of Edmonton's population;
- Representation of the diversity of artistic expression or styles within the discipline.

Prizes will be awarded in the spring of 2024.

The primary prize recipient in each category will be awarded **\$15,000**, and two secondary prizes of **\$5,000** will be awarded to the runners up.

City of Edmonton Book Prize Guidelines & Rules:

- The Robert Kroetsch City of Edmonton Book Prize recognizes Edmonton authors of books published in English or French and released in the 12 months (calendar year) prior to the deadline.
- Eligible works must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 31, 2023**.
- Works of fiction, nonfiction, poetry, or drama written for adults or children are eligible.
- The following types of works are not eligible: multi-author anthologies, books that are not in English or French, and unpublished pieces or manuscripts.
- If, in the opinion of the judges, no work in this competition merits an award, no award will be given. In all cases, the judges' decision is final.



Submission Procedures:

- Submit entry form at writersguild.ca/awards-entry no later than **December 1, 2023**.
- After you have submitted the electronic entry form, please mail or drop off books at the WGA office. *(Please note that our offices will be closed between **December 18, 2023 and January 1, 2024**, inclusive. We will reopen on January 2, 2024.)*
- Entries may be submitted by authors, publishers, or any interested parties.
- Ineligible materials will not be returned.
- Submissions must include a completed online entry form and five copies of the book entered as indicated on the entry form.
- Five copies of each book entered must be sent to the Writers' Guild of Alberta, postmarked no later than **December 1, 2023**.
- Submissions must be accompanied by a **\$35 fee per entry, payable by cheque or credit card**. Please make cheques payable to the Writers' Guild of Alberta.
- Books may be dropped off in person at the WGA Head Office in the Percy Page Centre in Edmonton on Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Fridays between **10:00 am and 3:00 pm MT** as of the week of **September 18** until **December 1, 2023**.

THE CITY OF CALGARY W.O. MITCHELL BOOK PRIZE

The City of Calgary W.O. Mitchell Book Prize is awarded in honour of acclaimed Calgary writer W.O. Mitchell and recognizes literary achievement by Calgary authors. Established in 1996, the Book Prize is coordinated through a partnership between The City of Calgary and the Writers' Guild of Alberta. Entries are judged by an independent jury recruited by the Writers' Guild of Alberta. The winning author will receive a \$5,000 cash prize.

The submission deadline is **December 1, 2023**. Authors who have been shortlisted will have an opportunity to deliver a reading in mid-April 2024. The prize will be announced with The Calgary Awards presentation in June 2024.

Submission Guidelines & Rules:

- Eligible books must have been published anywhere in the world between **January 1** and **December 1, 2023**.
- The author must be a Calgary resident for a minimum of two years, as of December 1, 2023.
- The following types of writing are eligible: fiction, poetry, nonfiction, children's literature, or drama.
- Self-published books are eligible for this award as long as they have an ISBN.
- The following types of works are not eligible: multi-author anthologies, cookbooks, guidebooks, textbooks, technical manuals, bibliographies or works of a purely academic or scholarly nature. Books of fewer than 48 pages (except children's literature), books that are not in English or French, multi-authored books (if any one of the authors is not a Calgarian), reprints or new editions of previously published books are also not eligible.
- If, in the opinion of the judges, no work in this competition merits an award, no award will be given.

THE CITY OF CALGARY W.O. MITCHELL BOOK PRIZE, CON'T

Submission Procedures:

- Entry forms must be submitted online at writersguild.ca/awards-entry no later than **December 1, 2023**. Printed forms may be requested if entrant is unable to access the online form.
- A \$35 fee per title must accompany submissions. Credit card payment is available through the online form, or cheques payable to the Writers' Guild of Alberta are accepted.

- Have produced a distinguished body of work over a longstanding career;
- Have made a major contribution to the Alberta writing landscape.


